


PHYSIOTHERAPIST FOR HIPPOTHERAPY



Horses can make children better. With a physiotherapist, the patient learns how to sit on the horse and harmonize with its movements. The physiotherapist chooses the horse, speed and terrain, where the child will be taken and for how long. The horse's calm gait and the undulations of its back may help children and adults recover from an accident. They also work with bad posture and muscular and balance problems. Hippotherapy is great for patients with anxiety or low self-esteem.

HORSE DENTIST

Reining in a horse by touching its mouth takes a lot of practice, as David knows. At his riding club, it took him half a year to find the courage to manage this for himself. Yet a horse dentist puts their hand in the mouths of horses they don't even know, every day! What courage it must take! Like a human dentist, a horse dentist treats overbites, tartar and broken teeth.



MOUNTED POLICE

Mounted police need a firm grip on the reins and confidence in the saddle – for pursuing a thief through narrow streets or driving away angry football fans, for instance. Such officers also need great patience and resourcefulness when training their four-legged partner. A police horse must be prepared for anything.


WORKING HORSES IN THE FOREST

While warmblood horses compete in races, humans use cold-blooded horses for heavy forest work - for their temperament. Cold-blooded horses are calm and good-natured, and so strong that they can pull up to one and a half times their own weight - i.e. one and a half tons. Where machines can't get, horses are indispensable.




RANGER



FISHING SCHOOL


